

Course Title: Spoken Arabic (Part 2 of 2)- **TEACHING MEDIUM:** Primarily Arabic

Course Faculty: Arabic Language

Course Description:

This course will offer students who have at least studied half of Madinah Book 3, Spoken Arabic Part 1 or equivalent the chance to practice and develop their spoken Arabic skills with an experienced native Arab speaker. The text that will be used in the class will be Book 2 of the popular Al 'Arabiyyah Bayna Yadayk' which is used all over the Arab world to teach non native speakers the Arabic language.

Course Overview:

In this course you will learn the following:

- How to speak about healthcare and nutrition
- How to speak about family life and children
- How to speak about the pros and cons of city life
- How to converse about knowledge and studying
- How to speak about occupations
- How to speak about the Arabic language, its history and legacy
- How to speak about competitions and awards
- How to speak the world as a global village
- How to converse about hygiene, cleanliness and their virtues
- How to converse intelligibly about the religion of Islam
- How to speak youth, its importance and pitfalls
- How to speak about the Islamic World
- How to speak about peace and security, their positive effects on life and their opposites
- How to speak about pollution and its effects on the environment and peoples' health
- How to speak about energy consumption and renewable and non-renewable resources
- A vocabulary list of approximately 750 words



Course Duration:

This course is taught over a 3 month period, each week's lesson consists of 3 hours class time.

Course Materials:

No books will be provided for this course, although copies of Al Arabiyyah Bayna Yadayk Book 2 will be available for students to use in class only. If you prefer you may purchase your own copy of this book which is available in most good bookshops. You should also bring a notepad and pen to take notes.

Homework:

For 3 hours of class work you will need to do at least 2 hours of homework and revision each week. It is recommended that you also develop a vocabulary list and a notebook for phrases and commonly used statements to aid your memorization.

Examinations:

The final examination consisting of a written paper and oral exam takes place on week 11. Your final mark determines if you will be able to continue on to the next level. The pass mark for this course is 60%.

Certificates:

You will receive an in-house certificate recognizing your achievement in this course.
